Inside the mansion, handsome woodwork and arches were installed by Benjamin Harrison VI in 1790 at the direction of Thomas Jefferson. Good Housekeeping magazine suggests: "If you only have time for one plantation, Berkeley should be at the top of your list." Guides in period costumes conduct tours of the original 1726 mansion and the museum collection includes Civil War artifacts as well as a unique collection of paintings by artist Sydney King. Next tour Edgewood Plantation, once a part of Berkeley Plantation. Edgewood was the ancestral home of US Presidents William Henry and Benjamin Harrison, a signer of the Declaration of Independence. This exquisite 7,000 square foot mansion dates to 1849. Lunch this afternoon will be at the Charles City Tavern after which you'll return to your hotel to relax and freshen up. Then, depart for Christmas Town: A Busch Gardens Celebration. Enjoy all new attractions, dazzling shows and one-of-a-kind gift ideas for that special person.
